Content

The work of a physiotherapist comprises assessment (and treatment), assistance and coaching of clients with health problems. During the studies of this physiotherapy program students will learn concepts and skills that they must use in their future work as physiotherapists. By covering the academic unit 'In-house clinical 1' satisfactorily, students develop capacities that belong to competency level 1 in order to be able to deal with 'real clients'. In this academic unit students' clinical reasoning is directly linked to the execution of relevant physiotherapeutic skills on specific patients, and dealing with clients is considered as more than a merely technical skill.
